Background: PV Sindhu is an Indian professional badminton player who is currently ranked 7 in the BWF World Rankings and the first Indian woman to win an Olympic silver medal. On 16 December 2018, Sindhu made history by becoming the first Indian to win the season-ending BWF World Tour Finals tournament in Guangzhou, China. With earnings of \$8.5 million, Sindhu was ranked seventh in Forbes' list of Highest-Paid Female Athletes 2018 based on earnings from prize money and endorsements between June 2017 to June 2018.
