Introduction

In the last eight years, the government of India has launched numerous welfare schemes that have empowered women and made them equal partners in India's development journey. In this journey, one of the schemes that has had a transformational impact is the Jal Jeevan Mission.

The lives of women have been transformed as they received the benefit of something as basic as tap water. Walking long distances to fetch water for daily consumption has now become history as households across the county can get tap water connections in their homes under the Jal Jeevan Mission.


Jal Jeevan Mission is a flagship program launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in August 2019, which aims to provide all rural households with tap water supply in adequate quantity & of prescribed quality by 2024.

In the absence of access to potable drinking water at home, families, especially women and young girls are forced to spend most of their time and energy fetching water for their families every day. Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) is making concerted efforts to free women from this age-old drudgery of carrying heavy loads to fetch water from great distances.

As on July 5, 2023, over 12.47 crore rural households across India have been provided with tap water connections across the country. Further, 132 districts, 1365 blocks, 80,329 Panchayats, and 1,68,319 villages have been reported to become Har Ghar Jal.

- **Rajasthan state's target is to increase FHTC** (Functional Household Tap Connection) from <u>11.49 lakhs to 92.84 lakhs</u> up to **2024**.
- State to constitute SWSM (State Water & Sanitation Mission) for implementation of JJM.
- Service level of <u>55 LPCD</u> (Liquid per capita per day) to be provided in rural areas with special emphasis on quality affected villages/habitations.
- Mandatory community contribution <u>@10% of in-village works</u>.
- Mandatory third party inspection for all components and delivery outcomes.
- All assets to be geo-tagged and FHTCs (Functional Household Tap Connections) are to be linked with Aadhar.
- Community to manage <u>Grey Water</u>.
- Works of rainwater harvesting, groundwater re-charging, and re-use of treated wastewater are to be done through MGNREGA, Central Finance Commission, State Finance Commission & Panchayati Raj.

A web-based <u>SAMPARK Portal</u> is functional in the state to log, monitor and redress consumer grievances through an online system. The Centre has urged the state to expand and upgrade the portal for the redressal of customer grievances at the block level and to upgrade its Command Control Centre for effective monitoring of all the schemes taken up under the Jal Jeevan Mission.

In 2023-24, an overall Gross Budgetary Support (GBS) of Rs.70,000 crore has been proposed for the implementation of JJM across the country, which is Rs. 15000 crores more than the Budgetary provision of Rs. 55,000 crore for FY 2022-23. Of the total Rs. 55,000 crores, the Centre allocated approximately 23% to Rajasthan at Rs. 13,328.60 crores.

Achievements in Rajasthan

- **Over 43.69 lakh rural households** in Rajasthan have been provided with tap water connections since the launch of the mission.
- **3,600 Villages** have become 100% Household Tap Connection with 1146 villages and **61 Panchayats** have reported to become Har Ghar Jal (it means that all households in that unit are provided with tap water supply).
- **63,127** (**73%**) **Schools** have been provided with tap water supply.
- 32,791 (61%) Anganwadis have been provided with tap water supply.
- **23,066 (72%) Gram Panchayats/Community Health Centers** have been provided with tap water supply.
- Rajasthan has **54 water testing laboratories**.
- Rajasthan has 5 aspirational districts i.e. Jaisalmer (18.47%), Dhaulpur (26.25%), Baran (31.60%), Karauli (39.36%) and Sirohi (43.79%).
