Through the establishment of **5,470** health camps across 995 Gram Panchayats, the Yatra has extended vital healthcare services to over **7,82,000** individuals. Almost **10 Lakh** Ayushman cards have been generated since the launch of the Yatra, providing crucial access to healthcare facilities for many.
