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#### FOREWORD


Panchayati Raj architecture enshrined in the Constitution aims to fulfill the "Gram Swaraj" vision of Mahatma Gandhi. This year we are also celebrating the 150<sup>th</sup> birth anniversary of Father of the Nation. Participatory democracy is best realized through the functioning of Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRI)/ Rural Local Bodies (RLB), especially at the Gram Panchayat (GP) level. To capture the aspiration and requirements of the Gram Panchayats, an elaborate exercise of preparation of Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) is undertaken to formulate a holistic plan, through convergence of resources by participatory process and approval of Gram Sabha. This exercise initiated on 2<sup>nd</sup> October brings about the realistic convergence not only among schemes but initiates constructive dialogue between the officials covering 29 sectors or 18 Departments and PRI elected representatives, as well as the citizens of GPs. The upshot of this elaborate exercise is formulation of one plan for one GP covering many if not all of the 29 Sectors and 18 Departments, which are devolved to the GPs. This plan is also available in the public space at [www.gdpd.nic.in](http://www.gdpd.nic.in).

Government of India supplement the efforts and resources of the States in not only formulation of holistic plan of the GP but in mapping the assets & infrastructure through Antyodaya Survey, identification of Gap and provision of resources for implementation of the GPDP. An elaborate mechanism for implementation of works covered under the GPDP and their monitoring through Information Technology tools has also been provided by Ministry of Panchayati Raj (MoPR), Government of India.

3. With such mechanism, the Gram Panchayats have been implementing the Government Schemes and Programmes. Further, this Ministry has been recognizing the performance and incentivizing the best performing PRIs/RLB through awards. Through these National Panchayat Awards best practices not only come in the limelight and recognised but these also get shared among the PRIs/ RLBs. These awards also carry a financial incentive, the award money is Rs. 5 to 50 lakhs (District/Intermediate/Village level) under Deen Dayal Upadhyay Panchayat Sashaktikaran Puraskar, Rs.10 lakhs per Gram Panchayat (GP)/Village Council (VC) under Nanaji Deshmukh Rashtriya Gaurav Gram Sabha Puraskar, Rs.5 to 20 lakhs per GP/VC under Gram Panchayat Development Plan

Award and Rs.5 Lakhs per GP/VC under newly introduced Child-friendly Gram Panchayat Award. This award money is to be utilized for public purposes especially livelihood support, assets creation, civic amenities creation & maintenance and bridging the gaps in the funds received from Union/State Governments for various projects.

4. I extend my congratulations to all awardees PRIs/RLBs/States/UTs of National Panchayat Awards-2019 and expect that these awards would further provide motivation to all of PRIs/ RLBs to achieve excellence in their activities for the next year. I also extend my appreciation to officers and staff of the Awards Division for proficiently completing the exhaustive exercise of completing the various processes involved for the awards.

# NATIONAL PANCHAYAT AWARDS – 2019

The adoption of the 73<sup>rd</sup> Constitutional amendment conferred Constitutional status on Panchayats as institutions of local self-government and introduced a three-tier structure of governance which ultimately lead to reinforcement of a participative democracy. The amendment mandates that resources, responsibility and decision-making power be devolved from Government to the local level through Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs)/Rural Local Bodies (RLBs), so that the latter become instruments of efficient delivery of services which would make a visible impact on the lives of our rural populace.

The challenges in infrastructure, manpower and capacity significantly impact the functioning Panchayats and is thus crucial towards governance at local level. However, experiences over the years have shown various instances where the PRIs/RLBs/States/Union Territories (UTs) have come up with innovative ways of overcoming these challenges, which are generally driven by local victors. Therefore, there is a need to recognize and promote such PRIs/RLBs/States/UTs which demonstrate virtuous performances in some of the priority areas in local governance.

Conscious efforts are being made towards strengthening of Panchayats and motivating them through awards wherein due recognition is given to the best performing Panchayats and States/UTs of the country. The extant scheme of Incentivization of Panchayats, which is a central component of restructured scheme of Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan of Ministry of Panchayati Raj (MoPR), provides an opportunity to approx. 2.60 lakh Panchayats (*2,53,069 at Village level; 6,716 at Intermediate level and 654 at District level*) across the country to be recognized at a national level. Thus, incentivization is a key driver of performance under various thematic areas and encourages the PRIs/RLBs/States/UTs to put in their best efforts in implementation of schemes at local levels. This initiative also keeps the motivation thriving for taking transformational measures in governance at local level.

Awards, including financial incentives, are given under the Incentivization of Panchayats scheme to best performing Panchayats/RLBs (*at District, Intermediate and Gram/Village levels*) and States/UTs in recognition of their good work for improving delivery of services and public goods. The awards are given on the National Panchayati Raj Day celebrated on 24<sup>th</sup> April every year. Awardees are selected based on well-defined guidelines, criteria and procedures. This incentivization encourages Panchayat/local body representatives who make special efforts; creates models for other Panchayats/RLBs and Gram Sabhas to follow and focuses public attention on performance of the awardees, especially local bodies. Finally, this creates an eco-system for overall good governance at the local level.

## Categories of National Panchayat Awards

1. **Child-friendly Gram Panchayat Award (CFGPA):** Keeping in view that the basic component of social development is creating a conducive atmosphere for the healthy growth and development of children, this award was announced on 1<sup>st</sup>

March, 2019 for one best performing Gram Panchayat (GP)/Village Council (VC) in each State/UT for adopting child-friendly practices.

## 2. e-Panchayat Puraskar

e-Panchayat Puraskar is given to incentivize States/UTs to adopt and implement the Panchayat Enterprise Suite (PES) Applications/State or UT specific Applications, automate the internal workflow processes of Panchayats and equivalent RLBs, enable electronic delivery of services making them more transparent, accountable and effective as organs of decentralized self-governing institutions through adoption and implementation of the e-Panchayat Applications. There is no financial incentive for this award. The States for this year's e-Panchayat Puraskar has been grouped into three categories – **(i) Category I** included States/UTs using PES Applications, **(ii) Category II (A)** covered States/UTs using both PES Applications and State specific Application providing similar functionality < 3 and **(iii) Category II (B)** included States/UTs using both PES Applications and State/UT specific Application providing similar functionality > 3. This was done to make the competition more intense. The States/UTs are evaluated on the following basis:

- Performance of the States / UTs with respect to their actual usage of the PES Applications viz. accounting, planning, monitoring of works, electronic delivery of services, social audit etc. Weightage is also given to corresponding State/UT specific applications.
- Innovative Measures taken by States/UTs for roll out of e-Panchayat MMP and operationalization of any State/UT-specific software application for Panchayats.
