Giving an insight on the session, Ms. Archana Verma Mission director, NWM emphasized that Nature apart from technologies one must focus on harnessing the potential of the community. Lastly, Chairperson Dr. Anu Garg appreciated the brilliant session and the valuable insights shared by the panelists.

ROLE OF CIVIL SOCIETY IN EFFICIENT WATER MANAGEMENT

A brilliant session was organized which was chaired by Shri A.C. Tyagi, Former Secretary General, ICID on Role of Civil Society in Efficient Water Management.
