Introduction¹

To address the challenge of rural poverty, the [Ministry of Rural Development](#) conceived a mission mode scheme titled National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM) in the year 2010. NRLM was renamed as [DAY-NRLM](#) (Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana – National Rural Livelihood Mission) with effect from March 29, 2016. It is a centrally sponsored scheme and the Central and State Governments jointly fund the projects.

The implementation responsibility of the Mission is vested with [State Rural Livelihood Missions](#) (Special Purpose Vehicles). At the district level, a District Mission Management Unit (DMMU) is responsible for planning and implementation under the overall control of the district administration. At the block level, a Block Mission Management Unit implements the Mission activities. The Mission is implemented in a phased but intensive manner, taking up certain number of blocks in each year. The Mission is expected to saturate mobilization of all rural poor households by 2023-24.

The Department of Rural Development in the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India has the overall responsibility of policy formulation, monitoring and evaluation of the programme and for release of funds.

Aims & Objectives

DAY-NRLM aims at mobilizing rural poor households into [Self Help Groups](#) (SHGs) in a phased manner and provide them long-term support to diversify their livelihoods, improve their

incomes and quality of life. Most of Mission's interventions are being implemented and scaled up by the SHG women themselves who are trained as community resource persons (CRPs) – *Krishi Sakhis, Pashu Sakhis, Bank Sakhis, Bima Sakhis, Banking Correspondent Sakhis* etc. The Mission is also working on empowering the SHG women through awareness generation and behaviour change communication on issues like domestic violence, women's education and other gender related concerns, nutrition, sanitation, health etc.²

The objective of the Mission is to promote sustainable livelihoods for the poor such that they come out of poverty. The institutions of the poor are intended to facilitate:

1. Access to formal credit
2. Support for diversification and strengthening of livelihoods
3. Access to entitlements and public services.³

NRLM Guiding Principles⁴

- Poor have a strong desire to come out of poverty, and they have innate capabilities.
- Social mobilization and building strong institutions of the poor is critical for unleashing the innate capabilities of the poor.
- An external, dedicated and sensitive support structure is required to induce the social mobilization, institution building and empowerment process.
- Facilitating knowledge dissemination, skill building, access to credit, access to marketing, and access to other livelihoods services underpins this upward mobility.

NRLM Values⁵

- Inclusion of the poorest, and meaningful role to the poorest in all the processes
- Transparency and accountability of all processes and institutions
- Ownership and key role of the poor and their institutions in all stages – planning, implementation, and, monitoring
- Community self-reliance and self-dependence

Key Features and components of NRLM⁶

1. One member (preferably a woman) from each rural poor household would be brought under the Self Help Group (SHG) network. Women SHG groups would have bank-linkage arrangements.
2. SHGs would be federated at village level and higher levels to provide space, voice and resources and to reduce dependence on external agencies.
3. The Mission consists four components:
 - i. [Social mobilization](#), [community institution](#) and [capacity building](#)
 - ii. [Financial inclusion](#)
 - iii. [Livelihood promotion](#)
 - iv. [Convergence & Partnerships](#)

4. Participatory social assessment would be organised to identify and rank all households according to vulnerability. The ranking would be with reference to poorest of the poor, single woman and woman-headed households, disabled, landless, and migrant labour and they would receive special focus.
5. Training and capacity building of the poor, particularly in relation to managing the institutions, livelihoods, credit absorption and credit-worthiness.
6. The Mission also supports development of skills for rural youth and their placement, training and self-employment through Rural Self-Employment Institutes (RSETIs), innovations, infrastructure creation and market support.
7. Provision of Revolving Fund as a support to SHGs to strengthen their institutional and financial management capacity and build a good credit history.
8. Provision of Community Investment Support Fund (CIF) in the intensive blocks to the SHGs through the Federations to advance loans and/or undertake common/collective socio-economic activities.
9. Introduction of financial inclusion model, loaning from banks, association and coordination with banking/financial institutions and coverage from loss of life, health etc.
10. Provision of Interest Subvention on loans availed by SHGs.
11. Convergence with various ministries and agencies dealing with poverty reduction of rural poor.
12. Highly decentralised planning; and States will have liberty in developing their own action plan for poverty reduction.
13. NRLM to have suitable linkages at the district level with District Rural Development Agencies (DRDAs) and Panchayat Raj Institutions (PRIs).

Services and Beneficiaries⁷

The beneficiaries under the scheme are rural poor and instead of providing direct financial support, the scheme envisages that the poor are organised into institutions and make them own the institutions, acquire sufficient capacity building and handholding support, access institutional credit and pursue livelihoods based on their resources, skills and preferences.

NRLM aims to alleviate rural poverty and create sustainable livelihood opportunities for the rural poor. In order to implement the programme in a Mission mode, the state governments are required to create autonomous societies, establish dedicated Mission implementation architecture at the state, district and block levels and set up adequate complementary systems (viz., human resource, administration, finance, procurement, MIS and M&E).

In this context, Union Cabinet in 2013 gave clearance to set up autonomous society at national level i.e., National Rural Livelihoods Promotion Society (NRLPS) under Ministry of Rural Development. NRLPS is envisaged as a compact, professional and multi-disciplinary body to provide wide ranging professional and technical support to the National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM) and the State Rural Livelihoods Missions (SRLMs) in the implementation of their Mission Objectives.

Recent initiatives under NRLM

- On 21st December 2021, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi visited Prayagraj and participated in a programme being held to empower women, especially at the grassroots level. The Prime Minister transferred an amount of Rs. 1000 crore in the bank account of Self-Help Groups (SHGs), benefitting around 16 lakh women members of the SHGs. This transfer is being done under DAY-NRLM, with 80,000 SHGs receiving Community Investment Fund (CIF) of Rs. 1.10 lakh per SHG and 60,000 SHGs receiving Revolving Fund of Rs. 15000 per SHG. The programme witnessed the Prime Minister encouraging Business Correspondent - *Sakhis* (B.C.-*Sakhis*), by transferring Rs. 4000 as first month's stipend in account of 20,000 B.C.-*Sakhis*.⁹
- On 12th August 2021, the Prime Minister released capitalization support funds to the tune of Rs. 1625 Crore to over four lakh SHGs. In addition, he released Rs. 25 crores as seed money for 7500 SHG members under the [Prime Minister Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises Scheme](#) (PMFME) of Ministry of Food Processing Industries and Rs. 4.13 crore as funds to 75 FPOs (Farmer Producer Organizations) being promoted under the Mission.¹⁰

- DAY-NRLM organized a special event called “Discourse on Rural Financial Inclusion” on 18th December, 2021 through virtual mode to celebrate 75 years of the independence of the country under Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. As a part of the event, the facility for overdraft (OD of Rs. 5,000/-) to verified SHG members under DAY–NRLM having accounts under the Prime Minister Jan Dhan Yojana with banks was launched. This facility has been initiated in pursuance of the announcement made by the Finance Minister in her budget speech of 2019-20. Six women SHG members from three States i.e., Rajasthan, Jharkhand and [Uttar Pradesh](#) (two from each State) were provided with a cheque of Rs. 5,000 to mark the start of the scheme. It is estimated that about five crore women SHG members under DAY-NRLM would be benefitted from this facility eventually.¹¹



- To bring a sharper focus on moving women to the higher economic order, the Ministry of Rural Development launched an initiative on creating *Lakhpati* SHG women, to enable rural SHG women to earn at least Rs.1 lakh per annum. For the realization of this ambitious goal, the Ministry has envisioned livelihood support to 25 million rural SHG women in the next two years. Based on various models existing across the country, a detailed advisory has been issued to the State Governments. A stakeholders consultation workshop was held with the States, BMGF (Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation) and TRIF (Transform Rural India Foundation) for further discussion on this subject on 28th October, 2021.¹²
- As part of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, a total of 152 Centres for Financial Literacy & Service Delivery (**SAKSHAM Centres**) across 77 districts of 13 states were launched under DAY-NRLM. These centres would act as one stop solution/single window system for basic financial needs of Self-Help Group (SHG) households in rural areas. The main objective of the centre is to provide financial literacy & facilitate delivery of financial services (savings, credit, insurance, pensions etc.) to SHG members and rural poor. These Centers will be managed by SHG network, largely at the level of the Cluster Level Federations (CLFs), with the help of trained Community Resource Persons (CRPs). Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) has also developed a mobile & web-based application called “**SAKSHAM**” which will be used by the community resource person of the Centre.¹³

- **Ministry of Rural Development signs MoU with Flipkart:** Flipkart, India’s homegrown e-commerce marketplace, has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Ministry of Rural Development of the Government of India (MoRD), for their ambitious Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana – National Rural Livelihood Mission (DAY-NRLM) program, to help empower local businesses and self-help groups (SHGs) – especially those that are led by women – by bringing them into the e-commerce fold. The partnership is aligned with the DAY-NRLM’s goal of strengthening the capabilities of rural communities for self-employment and entrepreneurship, thus providing further impetus to the Prime Minister’s vision of an “Aatmanirbhar Bharat”.¹⁴

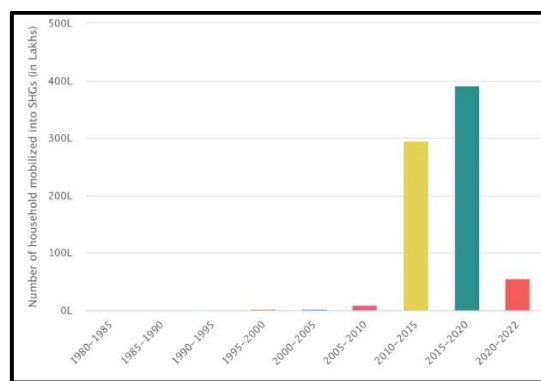
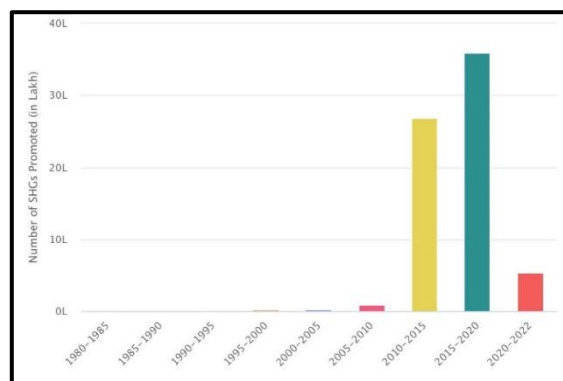

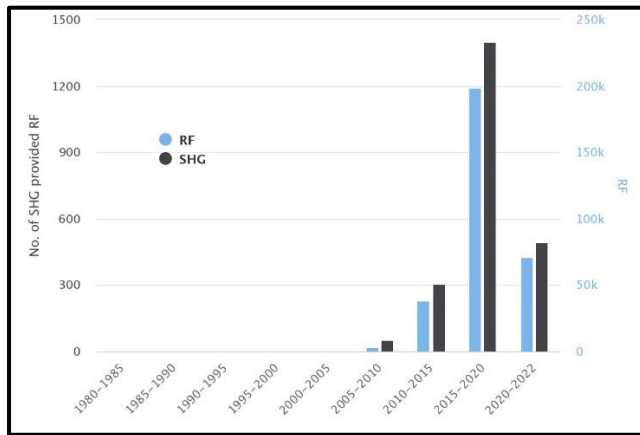

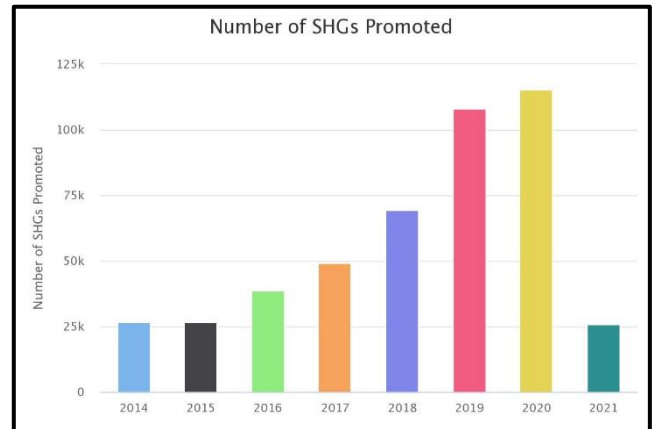

Success Stories of SHGs in Uttar Pradesh

- Khadi masks in Uttar Pradesh¹⁷** - Suman Devi is a member of an SHG in Hasanpur Gram Panchayat, Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh. Ever since she heard the news on television about the COVID-19 pandemic, she has been stitching masks for women in her own SHG group, children, and elderly in her community. Like Suman, all across Uttar Pradesh women in SHG groups played an important role in Uttar Pradesh State Rural Livelihood Mission's (UPSRLM) COVID-19 response strategy.

I watched news on the Corona Virus pandemic on television last month, heard several awareness messages on radio and advertisement in village that inspired me to do something and make people aware of the virus. I decided to stitch masks for poor SHG women, children and the elderly using my own resources. Until now I have stitched and distributed more than a 100 masks and made people aware on importance of frequent hand washing, physical distancing. But there is lot more to be done. As the shops open I will buy cloth and stitch more masks than before and will make sure that every needy person in my village has a mask-" - Suman Devi, member of Maa Viashnav SHG in Hasanpur gram panchayat of Trivediganj block, Barabanki



- Distributing masks amongst MNREGA workers¹⁸** - In UP's Siddharthnagar district 2,56,625 masks were distributed to Panchayats for their MGNREGA workers. To accomplish this, SHGs used part of Revolving Fund and Community Investment Fund for purchasing clothes from market, and after stitching, sold them through a selling point in block's premises.



- Prerna Canteens in Uttar Pradesh¹⁹** - 'Prerna Canteens' are managed by SHGs – which were set up a couple years ago by Uttar Pradesh State Rural Livelihoods Mission (UPSRLM) to ensure nutritional self-sufficiency in households – have been transformed into community kitchens and are working hard to ensure continuous cooked food supply to vulnerable households, quarantined people, and front-line health workers.
- Biofloc Fish Farming: An Innovative Sustainable Livelihoods Practice in Sonbhadra, Uttar Pradesh²⁰** - The SHG members in this area adopted the Biofloc fish farming technique for taking up pisciculture. This technique not only has lesser water requirement, it also takes smaller space for fish rearing.

Sangeeta Devi, a member of Shivguru Aajeevika SHG says,

“ We have availed a livelihoods fund of Rs. 2 lakh from our VO to start fish farming through biofloc method. Earlier we used to do it traditionally in natural water bodies. Due to low water level, numerous fish used to die causing loss in business. It was also insecure in open places as due to some feuds/jealousy, social elements at work would intoxicate the water body to cause harm. The new method is not only high-yielding with lesser space requirement, it also provides security from such incidences. Women members are able to take this up while being at their homes, it is helping them earn an income which they are utilizing for their children's better education and wellbeing of the household.”
